To the much honered The Governer Deputie Governer & Magestrats of the honered Court of Assistance now assembled at Boston Sept. 8: 1670: The Petition of William Stacey: Humbly Sheweth:

That Satan haueing filled his heart & layed a temptation before him, his corrupt nater was redy to imbrace it And therefore he Doe & must owne the sentence of the honered Court to be just upon him & according to his merit, the which may justly stop his mouth: for ever eraueing any favour from the sayd honered Court, In abateing or aquiting any part of his sentence: But becase his poore parents & masters family (wch are giltless) are afflicted by the remain[d]er of his suffering, Therefore if your poore Supplyant (an abject) may implore your honers favours to permit

the bagg\* of his iniguity to be taken off, viz the rope about his neck Dureing the Courts pleasure) it would be a great reviveing to his sayd parents and present master & famylie: wch if a poore contemptable person may obtaine It would deeply oblige him vnto your honers & vnto the lord for you, That have made you instrumentall for his humbling: & he hope for ever a reclamation from any horrid vice: Not Daring further to presume, but in all subjection your sayd supplyant doth hum, ly submitt & remaine
